Our Washington, DC Landmark Tins pay homage to the iconic monuments and buildings that make the National Mall a living testament to our country's great history. Lincoln Memorial

Over three million visitors a year come from around the country and the world to pay homage to Abraham Lincoln, “The Great Emancipator.” The building is in the form of a Greek Doric temple, with 36 columns surrounding the building, representing the 36 states in the re-formed Union at the time of Lincoln’s death. Dedicated in 1922 as a symbol of our country’s gratitude to Lincoln, the monument has always been a place where demonstrations for social change have taken place. One of the most famous was the August 1963 March on Washington, where the Reverend Martin Luther King gave his renowned “I Have a Dream” speech.



Capitol Building

Set atop Capitol Hill, the U.S. Capitol Building presides over the Washington National Mall, much in the same way that the legislators within the building’s hallowed halls preside over the debates that shape our country. Adorned with some of the finest and most recognizable artworks in the United States, including the famed Brumidi Corridors and The Apotheosis of Washington, the U.S. Capitol Building is a living monument to the past, as well as the functional home of American Democracy for the present and future.



Washington Monument

This 555 ft, 51/2 inch obelisk is perhaps the most iconic and well known of the architectural wonders on the National Mall. Constructed of marble, sandstone and granite, the Washington Monument was, at the time of its completion, the tallest structure in the world. It stands today as an apt tribute to George Washington’s towering influence of on American history.



Smithsonian

Built in 1855 of red sandstone in the Norman style, and known by locals as “The Castle” ever since, the Smithsonian Institute Building functions as the administrative headquarters of the Smithsonian Institution. The Smithsonian Institution was founded in 1846 at the bequest of British scientist James Smithson for the “increase and diffusion” of knowledge, and boasts over 30 museums and research centers under its administration.



Jefferson Memorial

Philosopher, writer, architect, inventor, and our third President, Thomas Jefferson left his indelible stamp on our nascent country as the author of the Declaration of Independence and organizer of the Louisiana Purchase. Built in 1943 and modeled after the Parthenon in Rome, the marble domed Jefferson Memorial stands as an enduring monument to one of the most influential figures in American history.



Iwo Jima

Since its inception in 1775, The United States Marine Corps has served in every American armed conflict including the Revolutionary War. Based on the iconic photograph taken of Marines raising the Stars and Stripes on the island of Iwo Jima in 1945, the U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial honors the sacrifice of all Marines who gave their lives in defense of the United States.
